- a. New Testament teaching (Matt 22:17-21; 1 Pet 2:13-17 and Rom 13:1-7)
- b. The authorities are 'God's servants'
- c. Submission to authorities quietens critics (1 Peter 2:15)
- d. We may need to 'obey God rather than man' on some issues
- e. Submission remains the over-riding principle
- f. Bad government is better than no government

(2) The 'good work' of relating well to all people (2)

- a. Shun slander (2a)
- b. Pursue peace (2b)
- c. Have humility (2c)

(3) Saved by grace, not by 'good works' (3:4-5)

- a. What we were (or would have been) (3)
- b. What we are now (4-7)
 - i. We are saved people (5)
 - ii. We are re-made people (5b-6)
 - iii. We are justified people (7)
 - iv. We are hope-filled people (7)

(4) Saved by grace, for good works (3:8)

- a. Good works enable us to have what we need (14a)
- b. Good works are part of our reason for living (14b)
- c. Good works are inherently good and help others (8)
